

History Corner

Nancy H. Phillips, Club Historian

1932-1934 President Emma Rowland

The Great Depression had arrived during these club years. Due to the Depression, attendance was very low at club meetings. The club programs centered around health care, conservation, Farmer's Relief Bill and Welfare and Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) Many local Lewes and Rehoboth men worked in the CCC Corps building highways, planting trees or applying mosquito control. Reciprocity teas and President's luncheons took place every year. The club donated money to a Tuberculosis Sanitarium to maintain a hospital for the needy.

In 1932, the clubhouse became a lending library. Members could purchase books at a very low cost or borrow books for \$.25 each. The club made an effort to increase their programs in order to bring more members out to the meetings. Musicals were held monthly. Dr. Hocker, local physician, spoke about his visit to the "Century of Progress Exposition", which was the Chicago World's Fair held from 1933-1934. The theme of the fair was technological innovation. The motto was "Science Finds, Industry Applies, Man Adapts." Science and the American way of life meshed together.



CALL TO THE GFWC DSFWC 124th ANNUAL CONVENTION "Seasons of Change" May 11 and 12, 2021

Article XII. Section 3. The Executive Board, delegates from the clubs in active membership, and one representative of each club or organization in Association Membership, shall constitute the voting body of the annual member.

Section 4. Clubs in active membership shall be entitled to representation.

a. Clubs with 10 members or more shall be entitled to representation.

Follows: 10 to 50-1 delegate: 51-100-2 delegates: 101-150-3 delegates: 151-200-4 delegates: 201-250-5 delegates.

- If less than 10 members, the club president or her representative shall be the representative at GFWC DSFWC State meetings and Conventions.
- c. The following shall be entitled to vote by virtue of her office: Directors, Standing and Special Committee Chairmen and Past GFWC DSFWC Presidents.
- d. No delegates shall vote unless wearing a delegate's badge. An alternate, in the absence of her delegate, if wearing a delegate's badge, shall be entitled to the rights and privileges of a delegate.
 Section 5. Members of the clubs in ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP and ASSOCIATE ORGANIZATIONS belonging to the GFWC DSFWC may attend the Annual Meeting upon payment of visitor's fee.
