HISTORY

Founded in 1905, the GFWC Zwaanendael Women's Club was organized by public-spirited women for the purpose of promoting community improvements through volunteer service.

For a number of years the Club's meetings were held in the homes of its members, and various other locations in the town of Lewes.

The Club's first meeting in the Clubhouse located at the corner of Savannah Rd & 3rd Street was on October 7, 1930. The decision was made to set up a lending library and offer use of the building to various community organizations.

In 1980 The Zwaanendael Club Building was listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The GFWC-Zwaanendael Women's Club is a member of the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) and the GFWC Delaware State Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC-DSFWC).

In 2015, the Zwaanendael Club Building was sold to the Lewes Historical Society. The Club's emblems remain on the building.
